The past year has been particularly devastating for many in our community, and the Rotary Club of Mumbai Lakers has continued its mission to aid the community in every way possible.

My predecessor took on these challenges and led the Club with aplomb despite many disruptions to the original plan. RCML created various projects encompassing all the different needs that arose at different stages of the pandemic and has been actively engaged in ongoing relief work.

I was inspired to take on this role by the two most important men in my life, my father and my husband. My father has always led by example, and has been my inspiration, my role model to contribute to the wellbeing and upliftment of the community. It's my privilege and I feel truly blessed while accepting the role of President for my elite club under leadership of DG Rajendra Agarwal. I have a team of 20 super-efficient, self-driven and experienced BOD members, who are committed to working for the cause. In the first month of the Dream year, my team has executed almost 31 projects, working selflessly, and I must say that I am all appreciative of them.



The Theme for The Rotary World for this year is "Serve to change lives" and the theme adopted by Mumbai District 3141 is - DREAMS of a better tomorrow. The LAKERS chose an apt theme for the Dream Year "Be the Change You Wish to See in the World".

Carrying forward the good work from past years with our ongoing projects like Plastic Free Powai, The Little Heart surgeries, Covid 19 relief and Annapoorna Campaign. Plastic Free Powai Project now collects MLPs from 27 buildings in and around Hiranandani and has already collected 6006.63 KGs of plastics. In the Month of July, we had the first little heart surgery of the year of a 25-day old baby. RCML is continuing with the Facilitation of Covid 19 Vaccination drive at Dr L H Hiranandani Hospital. We started our Annapoorna Drive on July 5th and fed 400 people for 7 consecutive days at Wadi in Jogeshwari thus, having a significant impact on the nutritional needs of the people fed.









From President Desk

Coming to the projects which began in Dream Year. One of the main focus areas this year are Cancer Patients- helping them with their diagnosis and providing them support. RCML is working with Tata Memorial to help patients with funding the cancer diagnostic tests for people who aren't able to pay for them. RCML also conducted a Cancer screening camp at Lower Parel for 125 Senior Citizens on 30th July. Also, on 31st July RCML committed to supporting Accesslife Adopt A Family Program. The family adopted by RCML is of little Braveheart Samiksha Tayade, 6 yrs. 10 months old cancer patient from Buldhana,

Maharashtra. Apart from this, funds were raised for hearing Aid for a Boy (Venkateshwar). RCML received 5 Oxygen Concentrators from the district and donated them to Revera Hospital at Vikramgad.

In Non-Medical projects, RCML has been participating in multiple tree plantations, in and around Mumbai. One such interesting plantation drive was to sponsor Miyawaki plantation at Chembur and another was providing fruit trees to farmers in Palghar. 500 meals were distributed to people staying in low lying areas of Bhandup and Mulund during the recent floods in Mumbai. Mahad, a small Taluka in Raigad district was also badly affected by the recent floods. RCML provided ration kits in these areas. Our ground partners at Mahad were CFTI. RCML also donated 7500 sets of Women's Undergarments to organizations working in Women Rescue and

Health and Sanitation and also to Premdaan and 10 tribal villages in Dahanu.

RCML has revived their vocational centre as well and Mr. Anil Bakshi's much loved English classes have resumed. Also, our community Interact club has begun the year on an active note and has started working on their projects early.

The pilot project of dream year is -STRUT YOUR STRUFF- A PROJECT TO DRIVE AWARENESS ON EVERYDAY FITNESS ALONG WITH CHARITY AND EXPLORE AS A FUNDRAISER AVENUE. IT IS ALIGNED WITH "FIT INDIA MOVEMENT"!

Major Highlights

Breaking the impenetrable silence -Lakers providing Hearing AID

Deafness is as severe a handicap as blindness (if not worse). Children born deaf face a world of silence, hence no speech, limited education, little chance of gainful employment and, therefore, a life of dependence and social isolation.

Hearing impairment is one of the most common birth defects seen these days. As the most critical years for the development of language skills are from birth to 5 years, early identification of hearing impairment enables us to give the child the enriched input they need to develop early listening, learning & speech skills. Rotary Club of Mumbai Lakers is sensitive to the problems faced by hearing-impaired people and has started working with Shravani Speech and Hearing Centre, run by Miss Geetanjali Singh. Shravani Centre is conducting audiological assessments to

quantify and qualify hearing in terms of the degree of hearing loss, type of hearing loss and the configuration of hearing loss. Once it has been identified, a treatment plan is put into place. This is where RCML partnered with Shravani Centre. We provided hearing aids to five children who needed them most urgently. Shravani Centre has a long list of children who need hearing aids, with varying degrees of hearing loss and urgency.

Many Lakers came forward and personally donated Rs. 47,500 required for each device. The children whose lives the Lakers touched are Anush Tiwari, Darpan Nikode, Venkateshwar Pillai, Arfat Khan and Vidhan Vasita. We would like to thank our donors Sony Suri, Tushar & Radhika Ullengal, Ravi &; Kamya Jaswani, and other Lakers who wish to remain anonymous.

Annapoorna Drive (Started July 5th, ended July 11th)

RCML fed a fixed set of 400 needy people on the streets and in slums in and around Powai and in Wadi, Goregaon for 7 consecutive days to have an impact on alleviating their nutritional needs under project Annapoorna. The food was prepared by cooks who have lost their jobs because of the Pandemic. This way the project provided two-way support - generating employment for the cooks and having an impact on the nutritional needs of the people fed.

Our ground partner for this project was Anum Foundation.

On 15th August, Under Freedom from hunger, RCML distributed 250 freshly cooked meals sponsored by Samasth Mahajan, guided by Robinhood army and JanSewa helped to identify beneficiaries and distribute them in Powai Vihar and Sangharsh Nagar. This will be an ongoing year long project. Another Annapoorna drive took place at Sangharsh Nagar on September 3, in association with Samast Mahajan & Rupas jan seva of Sangharsh Nahar . RCML along with our partners will be conducting these drives every 15 days.























Donation of Undergarments to Women's rescue foundations and in tribal areas of Dahanu

RCML donated 7500 sets of Women's Undergarments. 5000 sets were donated to organizations working in Women Rescue and Health and Sanitation. Apart from Women's Rescue Foundation, the remaining sets of undergarments were distributed to Premdaan

and 10 tribal villages in Dahanu. our partners for this project was Roshni Foundation.

The donation of the undergarments to Women's Rescue Foundation happened on 16th July, their distribution in Dahanu happened on 5th August.





















Relief for flood victims at Mahad (25th-30th July)

Mahad is a small Taluka in Raigad district with 181 small villages and a population of 55000 – 60000 people.

Since 19th July 2021 it's been raining continuously in Mahad. It rained so heavily that the whole taluka was flooded. In a disastrous landslide 32 houses were buried in mud and more than 138 people lost their lives. There was no electricity, no drinking water, and the communication set-up totally collapsed.

These heavy rains washed away everything. People lost lives of their dear ones, their

belongings, their homes. They did not have food to eat, clothes to wear as everything was totally wet. Conditions in Mahad were miserable and needed immediate help. What they needed was 2 hot meals a day and dry clothes to wear. Even after the flood water level receded, the situation was still grim. Families were stranded, had no access to basic necessities and were in immediate need of relief.

RCML reached out with ration kits and meals. Our ground partners for this project are CFTI (Centre For Transformation India)















Flood relief in low lying areas of Mulund and Bhandup: Responding to an urgent request which came through a fellow laker, for people staying in low lying areas of Bhandup and Mulund , that they needed urgent funds to feed these low line area underprivileged ppl who got affected in the rain . We kickstarted our year with the Annapoorna Project to eradicate hunger. We have been supplying meals at a rate of ₹15 a meal.

We have managed to get Star Donors, who have sponsored 1,000 meals or more, from within the community who are not Lakers. This just speaks of how hearttouching the campaign is, and how much trust the community places in our club.

In the COVID times, ration kits have been being distributed. This constitutes a large portion of our COVID Relief Campaign. Rotary Club of Mumbai Lakers has stood like the backbone of the community, giving a voice to the

requirements of the local people who really needed our help. The support provided by us has been extremely timely during the COVID crisis and invaluable to those we touched.



Rotary Club of Mumbai Lakers, who derive their name from the lake, are very concerned about this situation. RCML has been a part of all the citizen groups and forums working for the betterment of the lake and recently organised a six-member panel discussion on this topic.

The panelists came from varied backgrounds,

cutting across social strata and demographics. The panelists included academicians, activists, young entrepreneurs and people working with various NGOs. The panelists were Professor Shyam Asolekar (Professor of Environmental Science & Engineering at IIT Bombay), Debi Goenka (Executive Trustee of Conservation Action Trust), Sunil Lamba (Founder of Nisarg Swasthya Sansan), Sanjay Tiwari (Social Activist), Anuj Vohra (Management Consultant at Deloitte) and Ronak Shah (Brand Strategist at the DBB Mudra Group), and the discussion was moderated by Laker Deepak Daryanani.

Devices that improve hearing by making sounds audible to the deaf have penetrated the market, while new medical procedures have emerged to treat the conditions which cause hearing loss. But a lot of work still needs to be done in terms of inclusion. There are many of us who are interested in foreign cultures and learning a foreign language, but not many people from the hearing amd abled world even think of learning sign language. This further compounds the number of challenges that hearing-impaired people face while integrating with the mainstream.

As the most critical years for the development of language skills are from birth to 5 years, early id entification of hearing impairment enables us to give the child the enriched input they need to develop early listening, learning and speech skills.




